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## OPERATIVE DIRECT LARYNGOSCOPY - INFORMED CONSENT

PURPOSE: The structures of the larynx are exposed to view and made accessible without optical distortion using a special endoscopic tube during general anesthesia. The endoscopic tube is secured in a stable fashion to allow bimanual procedures to be performed within the larynx with and without additional optical magnification.

## POTENTIAL INDICATIONS:

- 1. Precise diagnosis of organic lesions of the larynx, particularly of those parts of the larynx which difficult to examine, and removal of a biopsy specimen for histology.
- 2. Drainage of abscesses and cysts, etc.
- 3. Complete removal of benign lesions from within the larynx, possibly with the laser.
- 4. Removal of local edematous swellings.
- 5. Removal of scars, strictures, synechiae, and webs, possibly with the laser.
- 6. Procedures to improve function in vocal cord paralysis and vocal cord defects.

## POSSIBLE ADVERSE EFFECTS:

Known potential adverse effects include:

- 1. Bleeding
- 2. Infection
- 3. Hoarseness from scar tissue formation
- 4. Injury to teeth
- 5. Temporary alternate airway access with tracheotomy
- 6. Adverse effect associated with general anesthesia
